

Education About Asia: Publication Agreement

Thank you for your submission to *Education About Asia*. Should your article be accepted for publication, copyright law and the accumulated lessons of journal publication make it necessary to request your signed acceptance of the following terms.

1. CONSENT TO PUBLISH: Whereas the Association for Asian Studies (AAS) is undertaking to publish at its expense (except as noted hereunder) the article named above, of which the undersigned is author, the author grants and assigns exclusively to the AAS for its use all rights, of whatsoever kind or nature now or hereafter protected by the copyright laws (common or statutory) of the United States and all foreign countries in all languages, in and to the above named article, including all subsidiary rights. The AAS, in turn grants to the author the right of republication in any book of which s/he is the author or editor, subject only to his/her giving appropriate bibliographical accreditation to *Education About Asia* and the inclusion of the phrase "reprinted with permission of the Association for Asian Studies."

2. PREVIOUS PUBLICATION: The author guarantees that the article furnished to *Education About Asia* is original and has not been published previously elsewhere in whole or in part; that it contains no matter which is defamatory or is otherwise unlawful or which invades privacy; that the material in the article does not infringe upon statutory copyright, common law right, proprietary right or any other right whatsoever; that there is no other owner of the rights herein conveyed to the AAS; and that such rights have not previously been conveyed, assigned, or encumbered in whole or in part to any other person or persons; and you agree to indemnify and hold the AAS harmless against any claim to the contrary.

3. MANUSCRIPT CORRECTION: The author will be given an opportunity to read and correct the final edited manuscript before typesetting. If, however, the author fails to return this manuscript by the date set by the editor, production may proceed without the author's approval of the final manuscript.

4. SUBSIDIARY RIGHTS AND COMPENSATION: The author will receive no monetary return from the AAS for the use of the material. Authors should be aware that AAS routinely grants permission for teachers, professors, and libraries to reproduce articles for classroom use only. AAS may also grant requests to reprint or translate all or any portion of the author's article to be published in a monograph, reader, anthology, second serial, digest, syndication, or non-book publication.

5. DELAY: *Education About Asia* reserves the right to postpone publication of manuscripts. If it is necessary for a manuscript to be postponed, the author may be assured that his/her manuscript will be published in a later issue.
